### PAYMENT OF ASSESSMENTS DUE BY NOVEMBER 1

When an emergency occurs, we want to be able to find your house easily! Please make sure that your home address is clearly marked on your house and mailbox to make it easier for emergency personnel to locate you. This means large, easy to read numbers that are highly visible from the street during the day or night. At this time of year it is easy to overlook the fact that your address numbers may be blocked by overgrown trees, flowers or shrubs. Cutting back overgrown landscape for ease of visibility could save valuable time when Officers or Fire personnel are trying to locate your house. Please make our job of helping YOU easier.

**BURNING ORDINANCE**

Be neighborly and respectful and try not to burn every day or too frequently. Burning is allowed as long as the following conditions are met:

1. There is no burning of garbage, material producing a noxious odor, material creating a health hazard, flammable liquids, open areas of standing grass, woods or brush, or combustibles in an amount exceeding two feet in height and five feet in diameter
2. Burning is allowed during daylight hours only
3. No burning when the wind exceeds 10 miles per hour
4. Burning in roadways or ditches is prohibited
5. Burning or combustibles must not exceed five feet in diameter and two feet in height. Burning must occur at least 25 feet from the front lot line, 15 feet from the side lot line and ten feet from the rear lot line
6. Adequate protection, such as a garden hose or fire extinguisher, must be readily available
7. When burning in a container, it must have a wire mesh cover with opening of 1/2 inch or less and be

**YARD WASTE COLLECTION**

Yard waste includes: brush, grass, leaves, garden debris.

Yard Waste Specifications:

1. Grass, leaves & garden debris shall be bagged in paper biodegradable yard waste bags, disposable cardboard boxes 3'x3'x3' (Appliance boxes ARE NOT acceptable), or unlined 32-gallon garbage cans with handles. You may also use plastic bags by purchasing and placing a sticker on each bag. Stickers in lots of twenty-five (25) for fifty cents (\$0.50) per sticker can be purchased at the Town Clerk's Office or by sending a payment of twelve dollars and fifty cents (\$12.50) along with a self-addressed stamped long 4 1/8" x 9 1/2" envelope to the Town Hall.
2. Brush (branches less than 2 inches in diameter) must be cut to 4 foot lengths and bundled securely.
3. No bag or bundle shall weigh more than 60 pounds.

Yard Waste must be at the curb the night before pick up.

Residents can come to the town hall from 8:00 am – 12:00 pm on this day only to drop off yard waste (and only yard waste). No plastic bags will be accepted. You must use paper yard waste bags or take home containers.

**REMINDERS**

- Dog waste may not be put into town park waste containers
- Dogs must be leashed when off your property
- No dumping is allowed at town hall or any town property
- Keep any non-trash items at least 20 feet away from waste containers on trash day

## PARK & REC NEWS

### LEARN TO SKATE

This 5-week class consists of developing basic ice-skating skills for youth ages 4-12. Youth will develop confidence on the ice by learning to forward and backward skate, turns and stops, and falling and recovery. It is suggested that young children bring helmets (bike or other helmet is fine) to the class.

Will include admission for public skate on the weekends for the duration of the session.

### FALL SOCCER

Residents and non-residents ages 4 - 6 are welcome to register for youth soccer from August 11 until August 28.

The season will run the weeks of September 7 to October 12 (depending on the weather). The program will be run in two levels again this fall; 4-year-

olds and 5-6 year-olds. The four-year-olds will practice once a week for 45 minutes and the 5-6 year olds will be once a week for approximately one hour. The last three weeks of the season, the 5-6 year olds will practice for about 30 minutes and play a game for around 30 minutes. All of these policies may be amended by the coach as needed.

5/6 yr: born between 8/1/03 - 7/31/05
