YARD WASTE COLLECTION

Yard waste includes: brush, grass, leaves, garden debris.

Yard Waste Specifications:

 Grass, leaves & garden debris shall be bagged in paper biodegradable yard waste bags, disposable cardboard boxes 3'x3'x3' (Appliance boxes ARE NOT acceptable), or unlined 32gallon garbage cans with handles. You may also use plastic bags by purchasing and placing a sticker on each bag. Stickers in lots of 25 for \$20 can be purchased at the Town Clerk's Office or by sending payment along with a self-addressed stamped 4 1/8" x 9 1/2" envelope to the Town Hall.

- 2. Brush (branches less than 2 inches in diameter) must be cut to 4 foot lengths and bundled securely.
- 3. No bag or bundle shall weigh more than 60 pounds.

Yard Waste must be at the curb the night before pick up.

BURNING ORDINANCE

Burning is allowed as long as the following conditions are met:

- There is no burning of garbage, material producing a noxious odor, material creating a health hazard, flammable liquids, open areas of standing grass, woods or brush, or combustibles in an amount exceeding two feet in height and five feet in diameter
- 2. Burning is allowed during daylight hours only
- 3. No burning when the wind exceeds 10 miles per hour
- 4. Burning in roadways or ditches is prohibited
- Burning of combustibles must not exceed five feet in diameter and two feet in height. Burning must occur at least 25 feet from the front lot line, 15 feet from the side lot line and 10 feet from the rear lot line
- 6. Adequate protection, such as a garden hose or fire extinguisher, must be readily available
- 7. When burning in a container, it must have a wire mesh cover with opening of ½ inch or less and be more than 25 feet from any building

FIREHOUSE NOTES

TOWN OF BROOKFIELD FIRE DEPARTMENT NEW AERIAL QUINT LADDER TRUCK

The town of Brookfield Fire Department recently took delivery of a new aerial quint ladder truck. The new truck was built by E-One out of Ocala Florida and was placed in service in March of this year. The new aerial has a seventy-eight foot ladder, a 1500 gallon per minute pump, and carries 500 gallons of water. The aerial quint carries a full complement of firefighting equipment making it capable of performing both aerial and engine operations. The new quint aerial replaced a 1992 aerial platform and will go by the designation of 2271. The new truck is capable of responding 24 hours a day with a full complement of personnel.

UNUSED MEDICINE AND PRESCRIPTION DROP-OFF

Town of Brookfield's new Drug Collection Unit site is open to the public from the hours of 8:00 am - 4:00 pm Monday-Friday at the Police Department and drugs can be dropped off with no questions asked.

Items that are ACCEPTED include: Prescription (controlled and non-controlled) and over-thecounter medications, vitamins, medication samples, pet medications, ointments, patches, nonaerosol sprays, creams, vials, and liquid medication in a leak proof container.

While unpackaged pills and medications should not be placed in the drop box, it is helpful to combine loose pills into a single secure bag or container that can be desposited into the drop box and to discard excessive packaging before depositing pills and medication into the drop

Items that are **NOT ACCEPTED** include: Illegal drugs, needles/sharps/ syringes, inhalers, aerosol cans, thermometers, biohazardous material (anything containing a bodily fluid or blood), hydrogen peroxide, household hazardous waste (paint, pesticides, oil, gas), and personal care products (shampoo, soaps, lotions, sunscreens, ointments, etc.).

CPR/AED Course

This course is designed for those 15 years and older. The program teaches basic level knowledge and skills required to recognize and respond appropriately to cardiac, breathing and first aid emergencies until advanced medical care arrives.

FROM THE JUDGE'S BENCH

Some New Laws you should know....

Relevant Today: The visibility headlight law (effective 2/16) requires drivers to on their turn headlights when weather conditions "limit

visibility." Limited visibility means any time that weather conditions limit visibility such that objects are not clearly visible 500 feet from the vehicle. In other words, turn your lights on in heavy rain, snow and fog.

Also, Wisconsin law now allows a person to carry any concealed knife (including switchblade) unless the person is prohibited under state law from possessing a firearm.

NEW LAW - Effective October 1, 2016, it will be illegal to use a cellphone while driving in a construction zone in Wisconsin. The new law does allow for the use of handsfree telephone equipment.
